

BEFORE THE ARRIVAL

Visa

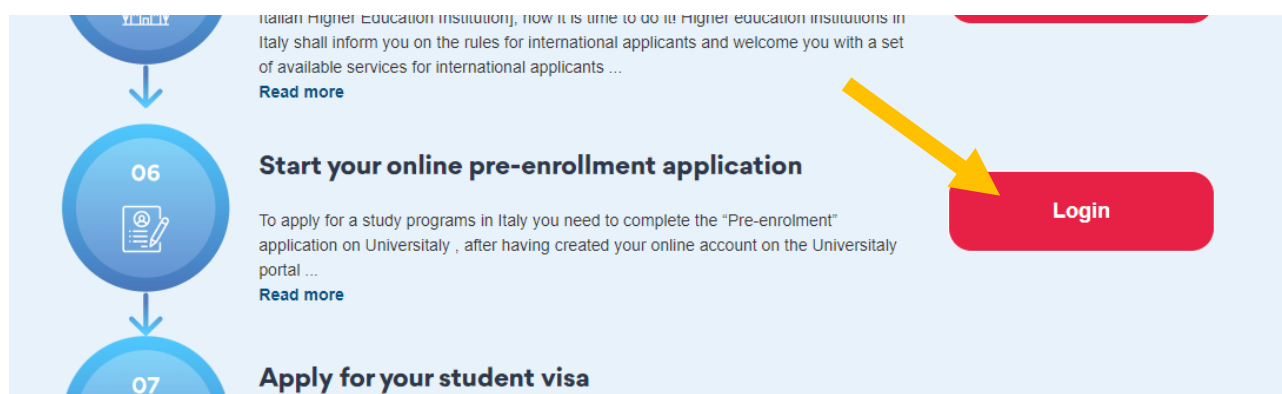
If you are a non-EU student intending to study in Italy for more than 90 days, you need a visa to enter Italy, unless exempt (see below). If your stay is less than 90 days, check with the Embassy (or Consulate) to determine whether you need to apply for a visa.

Attention: you must apply for a visa for "Study – Exchange and Mobility Program."

To apply for the visa, you must:

Pre-enroll online through the University portal (step 6 on platform). Pre-enrollments are open.

After clicking on LOGIN you have to register yourself, then you can login and start the application.

In the application, you need to specify the following information:

- Name
- Surname
- Birth Date
- Gender
- Country of birth
- Town/City of birth
- Current Citizenship 1
- Street
- Number
- Country
- Town/City
- ZIP Code
- Telephone
- E-mail
- Italian tax code: ONLY if you have one (optional)
- Passport number
- dd/mm/yyyy
- Upload a passport size picture of your face
- Upload your valid passport
- Where will you apply for a visa?
- Reason - **Erasmus+ or other exchange programmes for studies/traineeship**

- Institution - **Università**
- Institution Name - **Università degli Studi "G. d'Annunzio" CHIETI-PESCARA**
- Course Type – **Bachelor/Master etc**
- Course Name – **the one you choose in our university (don't worry about that, just pick the one which is close to your actual field of study)**
- Course Curriculum

You also need to specify the Embassy/Consulate where you will apply for the entry visa. The pre-enrollment application will be verified by the University of Chieti-Pescara and forwarded to the Embassy/Consulate you indicated. The University will also provide you with an invitation letter;

Contact the Embassy/Consulate to learn about the requirements for obtaining the entry visa for "Study – Exchange and Mobility Program" and to schedule an appointment if necessary.

You must apply for the visa well in advance because the visa issuance process may take several months.

AFTER THE ARRIVAL

RESIDENCY PERMIT

If you are a non-European Union (non-EU) exchange student planning to stay in Italy for more than 90 days, you must apply for a residence permit within 8 working days from your entry into Italy (except for cases of exemption, for which only a Declaration of Presence is required: see above).

General Information

It is crucial to submit a complete residence permit application with all the necessary documents. If your study permit application is complete upon submission, you will receive the permit more quickly. If you need to supplement missing documents after submission, the processing time for the permit may be extended by several months.

- If you do not have health insurance, obtain it or enroll in the Italian National Health Service.

ESN and the international office will help you to submit your request.
