



**Call for Applications – 15 Scholarships to International Students (of which 5
scholarships for students enrolling in Joint Programmes or INGENIUM Pathways)**

2026–2027 a.y.

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Article 1 – Purpose and duration of the scholarship

1. This Call for Applications governs the awarding of 5 scholarships for international students enrolling in Joint Programmes or INGENIUM Pathways and 10 scholarships for international students enrolling in the Academic Year 2026/2027 in one of the following Degree Programmes:
 - Bachelor in Economics And Finance;
 - Master in Psychology OF Well-Being and Performance;
 - Master in Planetary Sciences;
 - Master in Health Professions of Rehabilitation Sciences;
 - Master in Building Engineering – Engineering Management Of Cultural Heritage;
 - Master in Computational Cognitive Science;
 - Master in Economics and Management;
 - Master in Legal Sciences for Internationalisation and Business Innovation;
 - Master in Economics And Finance.
2. The scholarship is awarded for the whole established duration of the degree programme, starting from the date of enrolment.
3. Scholarship payments will begin only after the applicant has completed his/her enrolment at the University.

Article 2 – Financial Provisions and Additional Support Services

1. The scholarships made available under this call for applications provide for:
 - a) A financial contribution of € 6,000.00 - gross amount - (before institutional charges), to the winning students;
 - b) Full exemption from University fees, with the exception of the tuition fee (regional fee - €140.00 and stamp duty - €16.00)
2. Additional support services include:
 - reception, orientation, integration into the University and social context of reference at the responsible offices for student mobility;
 - assisted procedures for access to the University online system (MYPAGE Ud'A);



- personalised reception and psychological support services and teaching materials for students with disabilities or specific learning difficulties;
- Italian language course.
- 3. **These scholarships are incompatible with grants awarded by other public or private institutions, including regional scholarships (ADSU Chieti-Pescara), scholarships for beneficiaries of international protection promoted by the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MAECI), CRUI, foreign governments or institutions. Should the above occur the scholarship will be revoked.**
- 4. Scholarships are awarded within the limits of the financial resources allocated in the University budget.

Article 3 – Eligibility Criteria and Allocation of Scholarships

The 15 scholarships are reserved for students holding an entry qualification obtained abroad, recognized for admission to the selected Degree Programme.

Article 4 – Admission Requirements

1. The requirements for submitting applications for admission are as follows:

a) Access to First-Cycle Degree (Bachelor’s Degree) - applicants must hold a qualification obtained after at least 12 years of schooling.

In the case of applicants from countries where the local education system is 11 or 10 years:

- certification of university attendance in the country of origin and successful completion of all first-year exams (11-year system) or first two-year exams (10-year system) or
- a post-secondary qualification obtained from a non-university higher education institution in a related field (1 year for 11-year systems; 2 years for 10-year systems) or
- certification issued by an Italian university attesting completion of a foundation course covering the missing years of schooling;

b) Access to Second-Cycle Degree (Master’s Degree)

Applicants must hold:

- a foreign academic qualification granting access to Master’s Degree programmes; or
- a foreign post-secondary qualification that allows progression to the next academic level in the issuing country.

Transfers from other Italian universities are not permitted.

Article 5 – Application Procedures and Submission Deadlines

To participate in the call for applications, candidates must first register for the University's online services at

selecting “Registration” from the menu at the top right. The system will send the candidate an email containing the username and password required to log in and register for this call for applications. After logging in, candidates must select from the “Registrar’s office” menu “Evaluation test” → “Registration for the assessment test - call for applications - 15 scholarships for international students - 2026/27 a.y.” and then follow the instructions provided by the system.

The application deadline is 20 April 2026 at 23:59 (Italian time).

The online procedure will be available from 12 March 2026.

1. Applications submitted in formats and/or methods other than those indicated above will be excluded from the selection process.
2. Candidates who do not meet the requirements set out in Article 4 will also be excluded.
3. The University accepts no responsibility for delays or errors attributable to malfunctions in the candidate's internet connection.

Article 6 – Required Documents

1. Applicants must upload:
 - a) Valid passport/ID copy;
 - b) Curriculum Vitae;
 - c) Motivation letter (in English);
 - d) Degree programme selection form (Annex 2);
 - e) English language certification (B2 level) for programmes taught in English.
 - f) A copy of the academic qualification and/or documentation certifying the studies completed for the purpose of obtaining the qualification (Upper Secondary School Diploma or First-Level Degree) required for admission to an open-access Bachelor’s Degree Programme (three-year programme) or Master’s Degree Programme (two-year



programme) of the University, issued by the Institution at which the qualification was awarded.

- g) Official transcript of records certifying the university examinations passed, including the corresponding grades.

***Clarifications**

Documents referred to in points f) and g), if issued in a language other than Italian, must be accompanied by an official sworn translation into Italian. Such documents must be legalized by the competent Italian Diplomatic Representation (or bear the Apostille stamp), or alternatively be accompanied by a Statement of Verification issued by CIMEA.

In addition, applicants are required to submit a Declaration of Value issued by the Italian Diplomatic Representation in the country where the qualification was obtained, or a Statement of Comparability/Correspondence issued by an ENIC-NARIC centre. ***The documents listed above in the “Clarifications” section, apart from the certified translation into Italian, may be provided later, but in any case, before enrolment.**

Article 7 – Selection Procedure and Evaluation Criteria

The Welcome Office is responsible for evaluating the admission requirements referred to in Article 4 and Article 6 of this Notice.

1. Applications will be evaluated by a special University Committee appointed by Rector's Decree.
2. Applications will be assessed exclusively on the basis of qualifications.
3. The Selection Committee has a total of 100 points, allocated as follows: 60 points for academic qualifications and 40 points for the assessment of the CV and cover letter.

At the end of the evaluation, a final ranking will be drawn up.

In the event of a tie, preference will be given to the younger candidate; if the tie persists, preference will be given to female candidates.

Information regarding the results of the selection process and the awarding of scholarships will be published on the University portal on the page dedicated to this Call for applications.



5. All candidates will receive personal notification of the selection results.
6. Successful candidates must enrol by the deadlines set out in the study programme for the academic year 2026/27. Only once enrolment is completed, winners will be able to receive the first instalment of the scholarship. Failure to enrol by the deadlines will result in forfeiture of scholarship status.

PLEASE NOTE that

The enrolment procedure for second-level courses will require further verification of both documentation and additional requirements (e.g. curricular requirements) by a special committee appointed by the course of study.

Even if successful in this selection process, candidates interested in enrolling in a Master's Degree Programme may not be considered eligible for enrolment by the Programme's evaluation committee because they do not meet the curricular requirements set out in the Programme's Teaching Regulations. In this case, candidates will not be able to complete their enrolment and, therefore, receive the scholarship.

Article 8 – Requirements for Maintaining and Renewing the Scholarship

To maintain the scholarship awarded under this Call for applications, beneficiaries must meet the following academic requirements for each year, following the first, up to the normal duration of their degree programme:

- Bachelor Degree:
 - a) Enrolment in the 2nd year of the course with at least 30 ECTS credits acquired by 31 October of the reference year;
 - b) Enrolment in the 3rd year with at least 95 ECTS credits acquired by 31 October of the reference year.
 - Master Degree:
 - a) Enrolment in the 2nd year of the course with at least 48 ECTS credits acquired by 31 October of the reference year;
1. The scholarship will be paid according to the following schedule:

PLEASE NOTE that

If the merit requirements (CFU) for maintaining the scholarship are not met by the deadlines, no further instalments of the scholarship will be disbursed. The scholarship will therefore be retained by the University and will be reinstated once the student has achieved the required number of credits for the deadline following the one missed. If the student fails to obtain the required credits for two consecutive deadlines, the scholarship will be revoked.

Article 9 – Acceptance, Renunciation and Revocation

1. Candidates are required to expressly accept or waive the scholarship within 10 days of receiving the notification referred to in Article 7, paragraph 5. Failure to respond within this period will be considered as a waiver of the scholarship.
2. Assignees who require a visa must follow the procedure indicated by the Ministry of University and Research for the enrolment of foreign students, applying for a visa. <https://www.universitaly.it/studenti-stranieri>
3. Loss of student status as a scholarship recipient (e.g., withdrawal from studies, interruption, transfer to another university, etc.) will result in immediate revocation of the scholarship. Any instalments not yet disbursed will not be paid.

Article 10 – Processing of Personal Data

The University of Chieti-Pescara 'G. D'Annunzio' processes personal data in compliance with Regulation (EU) - GDPR - 2016/679 of 27 April 2016, the CODAU Guidelines on privacy and personal data protection in universities adopted and endorsed by the University with resolution no. 119/2018 of 24 April 2018 of the Board of Directors, and Legislative Decree no. 196/2003 -Privacy Code as amended by Legislative Decree 101/2018.



The personal data collected and processed, including by automated means, are those provided directly by the candidates and will be used exclusively for the purposes of managing this Call for Applications and related procedures, including in the event of litigation.

The provision of such data is mandatory for the purposes of participation in the selection process: failure to provide or refusal to provide data will make it impossible for the Data Controller, the Data Processor and the persons in charge of processing to carry out the processing operations necessary to establish any relationship with the University.
