The "G. d'Annunzio" University of Chieti-Pescara offers a Bachelor's Degree Program in Economics and Finance (L-33) for the 2026/2027 academic year. **Admission to the program is subject to a limited number of places.**

The program is divided into **two curricula**:

- **Economia Commercio e Finanza**, delivered in Italian;
- **Economics Business and Finance**, delivered in English.

## ART. 1 – AVAILABLE PLACES

For the 2026–2027 academic year, 200 places are available, as follows:

- a) **100 places reserved for EU and non-EU candidates residing in Italy** (Article 26 of Law No. 189 of July 30, 2002), including those that become available as a result of:
  - students' transfers to other degree programs or to other universities;
  - withdrawing students;
- b) **100 places reserved for non-EU candidates residing abroad**

If for one of the above categories, the number of applications is fewer than the available places, the remaining places may be added to those set for the other category.

## ART. 2 – SELECTION PROCESS, RANKING LISTS AND REALLOCATIONS

Registration for the selection process allows candidates to be included in the merit rankings. Enrolment in the program is permitted for candidates who are placed in one of the first 100 positions on the merit ranking.

Candidates must register online via the **Ud'A Online website** ► <https://unich.esse3.cineca.it> following the procedure outlined in Article 3 below (► [art. 3 – Registration for the selection](#)).

The selection process involves verifying that candidates have adequate cultural background, aptitude for learning, and language proficiency, in accordance with the procedures and terms set forth in this Call.

### 2.1 – Admission requirements

When registering for the selection, candidates must demonstrate that they meet the required qualifications in terms of cultural background, aptitude for learning, and language proficiency, by uploading the following documents to the **Ud'A Online website** (<https://unich.esse3.cineca.it>):

- A. **Regarding cultural background and aptitude for learning: a certificate confirming that you have taken one of the following tests:**
  - a) **TOLC-E or English TOLC-E** with a minimum score of **10** (<https://www.cisiaonline.it/>)
  - b) **CEnT-S** with a minimum normalized score of **23** (<https://www.cisiaonline.it/>)
  - c) **SAT** (<https://satsuite.collegeboard.org/>) with a minimum score of **980**

**TOLC-E, English TOLC-E and CEnT-S** can be taken **both remotely/online (TOLC@CASA, CENT@CASA) and in person/on-site (TOLC@UNI, CENT@UNI) at any University affiliated with CISIA.** The "G. D'Annunzio" University of Chieti-Pescara organizes CISIA tests remotely (The dates will be announced shortly on the University's website).

**TOLC-E, English TOLC-E, CEnT-S, and SAT:** only tests taken on or after January 1, 2024, are considered valid.

- B. **Language requirement:** demonstrating proficiency at a level equivalent to **at least B2 on the CEFR** in the language of instruction (Italian for the curriculum in Economia Commercio e Finanza, English for the curriculum in Economics Business and Finance).

This level is automatically recognized for native speakers, or—alternatively—may be demonstrated by a valid certificate issued by one of the following organizations.

The English language proficiency requirement is also considered met if the applicant holds appropriate certification confirming that the previous degree was earned with **English as the Medium of Instruction**.

## 2.2 – Ranking Lists, Enrolment Deadlines, and Reallocations

Candidates who meet the requirements set forth in paragraph 2.1 above will be placed on the respective merit lists **in chronological order based on the date of completion of the registration for the selection**.

**Only those who secure a qualifying position on the ranking list—including those who secure it during subsequent reallocations—will be eligible to enrol in accordance with the procedures and deadlines set forth in this Call.**

**The following are considered to be in a qualifying position**

- candidates ranked in the top 100 of the merit list for EU and non-EU candidates residing in Italy;
- candidates ranked in the top 100 of the merit list for EU and non-EU candidates residing abroad;

**Starting July 1, 2026, candidates who have been placed on the aforementioned merit lists may enrol in the degree program until all available places are allocated (► [art. 1 – Available places](#)).**

Should ranking lists also include applicants who are not initially within the available quota but who nevertheless satisfy all requirements necessary to complete enrolment (see the following [art. 6 - Enrolment](#)), applicants initially placed within the available quota may be requested, according to the chronological order of completion of their application, to complete enrolment within fifteen working days.

Either failure to complete enrolment or formally withdraw within this deadline may result in the applicant losing the priority acquired at the time of application and being overtaken by other eligible candidates.

### ART. 3 – REGISTRATION FOR THE SELECTION

Applications for the selection process must be submitted exclusively online from the date of publication of this Call, following the procedure outlined below:

- 1) Go to the *Ud'A Online* website ► <https://unich.esse3.cineca.it/> and select "Registration"/"Registration with SPID", by entering the requested personal information and your bank account details (select *Rimborso bonifico bancario*: IBAN required for refunds);

If you already have valid username and password for the University, use them (you MUST NOT register again). For lost username and passwords contact the InfoStudenti service ► <https://www.unich.it/infostudenti>

- 2) Log in to your "Personal Area" using the your credentials (username and password);
- 3) Select the menu items: *Registrar'Office* → *ADMISSION TEST*;
- 4) Select the course type: *Degree Course*;
- 5) Select the *Economics and Finance Degree Program (L-33)*;
- 6) Select the relevant applicant category:
  - *EU and non-EU applicants residing in Italy*, option **Economia Commercio e Finanza curriculum (delivered in Italian)**;
  - *EU and non-EU applicants residing in Italy*, option **Economics Business and Finance curriculum (delivered in English)**;
  - *non-EU applicants residing abroad*, option **Economia Commercio e Finanza curriculum (delivered in Italian)**;
  - *non-EU applicants residing abroad*, option **Economics Business and Finance curriculum (delivered in English)**;
- 7) Enter the details of your academic qualification (if you have not yet obtained the qualification at the time of applying for the selection process, specify the school, type of diploma, and year of completion without providing the date)
- 8) Upload a scanned copy (front and back) of a valid ID (*PDF* o *JPEG*);
- 9) Upload *Attachment A* – Certificate confirming that you have taken one of the following tests: TOLC-E, English TOLC-E, CEnT-S, SAT;
- 10) Upload *Attachement B – Language certifications*
  - Proof of Italian language proficiency at least at the B2 level of the CEFR (for international applicants choosing the **Economia Commercio e Finanza curriculum**);
  - Proof of English proficiency at least at the B2 level of the CEFR (for applicants choosing the **Economics Business and Finance curriculum**).

The aforementioned certifications must meet the validity criteria set forth in Section B of [par 2.1 - Requirements for the Selection process](#).

Once you have completed these steps, you will be able to confirm your registration and, starting July 1, 2026, complete the enrolment process (see [art. 6 - Enrolment](#)).

### ART. 4 – EDUCATIONAL QUALIFICATIONS

Admission to the Bachelor's Degree in Economics and Finance requires an upper-secondary school qualification recognised under current legislation or a foreign qualification recognised as suitable for admission (see to [par. 4.2](#)).

Evidence of the qualification is not required at the application stage but must be provided during enrolment.

#### 4.1 – Qualifications obtained in Italy

Admission to the Bachelor's Degree Program in Economics and Finance requires a high school diploma recognised under current.

Applicants admitted on the basis of a four-year secondary-school qualification not including an additional integration year (except for experimental pathways specifically authorised by the Ministry of Education and Merit) shall be assigned an educational deficit to be made up in accordance with the procedures outlined in the *Students' Guidelines for the 2026/2027 academic year*, which will be published on the University website  
► <https://www.unich.it>.

#### 4.2 – Qualifications obtained abroad

Applicants holding a foreign upper-secondary school qualification must provide the following documentation:

- a) A high school diploma obtained **after at least 12 years of schooling**, or a legally equivalent certificate. If the secondary school diploma was obtained **after fewer than 12 years of schooling**, please refer to the provisions in Annex 1 to the MUR Circular for the 2026/2027 and 2027/2028 academic years: "[Procedura per l'ingresso, il soggiorno, l'immatricolazione degli studenti internazionali e il relativo riconoscimento dei titoli, per i corsi della formazione superiore in Italia](#)".

The diploma must come with a **Statement of Verification** issued by the Italian ENIC-NARIC centre (CIMEA) or **legalized** by the Italian diplomatic authority, with an **Apostille** stamp (for countries that are parties to the 1961 Hague Convention). In addition, it is also required a CIMEA **Statement of Comparability** or **Statement of Correspondence** or, alternatively, a **Declaration of Value**.

- b) documentation certifying successful completion of any **academic entrance test**, if such test is required for admission to a university in the country where the qualification was obtained;
- c) **certified translation** into Italian or English of the documents listed above in a) and b).

The University reserves the right to request additional documents as deemed necessary, including those required to verify the authenticity of the foreign academic credential.

### ART. 5 –NON-EU CANDIDATES RESIDING ABROAD

#### 5.1 – Pre-enrolment on Universitaly

Non-EU applicants residing abroad must register on the UNIVERSITALY website (<https://www.universitaly.it>) and complete the online pre-enrolment application.

In order to enable the preliminary assessment of individual applications, the documents listed under points A and B of Article 2 of this Call, as well as the documents required for applicants holding a foreign qualification (see Section 4.2), must be attached to the pre-enrolment application.

The pre-enrolment application will be assessed through the UNIVERSITALY website: the University will verify the qualifications and academic documentation submitted and will inform the relevant diplomatic-consular representations whether the application is approved, rejected, or requires additional information.

Once the pre-enrolment application has been validated by the University, candidates must apply to the Italian consular authority in their country of residence for a study/university enrolment visa (Type "D" visa). The validation of the pre-enrolment application by the University does not guarantee any right to visa issuance.

Visa applications must be submitted sufficiently in advance to ensure compliance with the enrolment deadlines set out in Article 6 below and, in any case, no later than 30 November 2026, unless otherwise provided for in future instructions jointly issued by the Ministry of University and Research (MUR) and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation (MAECI).

For all matters not expressly regulated herein, reference shall be made to the MUR Circular for Academic Years 2026/2027 and 2027/2028 entitled: "[Procedura per l'ingresso, il soggiorno, l'immatricolazione degli studenti internazionali e il relativo riconoscimento dei titoli, per i corsi della formazione superiore in Italia](#)".

## 5.2 – ITALIAN LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY TEST

**For applicants to the Economia, Commercio e Finanza curriculum (italian-taught) who require a Type "D" visa, a test of Italian language proficiency is mandatory.**

The language test will be held online via the Microsoft Teams platform and will be conducted by a Committee appointed by Rectoral Decree. (► [art. 8 – ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURE TRANSPARENCY](#)).

**Applicants will receive an official invitation to the email address used for registration on the UNIVERSITALY portal, containing all instructions for taking the test.**

The outcome of the language proficiency test will be certified by the University within the pre-enrolment application on UNIVERSITALY. If the test is not taken, it will not be possible to validate the application.

The Italian language test is not required for applicants who hold

- Italian language certificates at a level no lower than B2 of the CEFR, issued by the certifying bodies listed in point B of paragraph 2.1 (Admission requirements). These certificates may be obtained in the applicant's home country or at accredited examination centres worldwide.
- a four- or five-year upper secondary school diploma obtained from Italian state schools or officially recognised Italian schools abroad;
- final secondary school qualification listed in Annex 2 of the MUR Circular for Academic Years 2026/2027 and 2027/2028 "[Procedura per l'ingresso, il soggiorno, l'immatricolazione degli studenti internazionali e il relativo riconoscimento dei titoli, per i corsi della formazione superiore in Italia](#)".
- supplementary certificates to the lower secondary school leaving qualification obtained in Argentina, certifying attendance of a study programme that included Italian language instruction for at least five years, pursuant to Law No. 210 of 7 June 1999 (Official Gazette No. 152 of 1 July 1999)
- Diploma in Italian Language and Culture awarded by the Universities for Foreigners of Perugia and Siena.

**For applicants to the Economics, Business and Finance curriculum (English-taught) who require a Type "D" visa, the Italian language test is not required. However, they must provide appropriate certification of adequate proficiency in the language of instruction of the programme, in accordance with point B of paragraph 2.1 above (Admission requirements).**

## ART. 6 – ENROLMENT

### 6.1 – Requirements, steps and deadlines

The enrolment application consists of two stages:

1. pre-enrolment;
2. finalisation of enrolment.

**Please note that the pre-enrolment procedure specified here is mandatory for all candidates (EU and non-EU candidates residing in Italy or abroad) and differs from the Universitaly pre-enrolment procedure, which is required only for non-EU candidates residing abroad.**

**Non-EU candidates residing abroad may finalise enrolment only upon obtaining a study/university enrolment visa (Type "D" visa).**

**Enrolment applications shall be processed, in accordance with Section 2.3 of this Call for Applications, from 1 July 2026 to 31 January 2027. The enrolment fee may be paid as follows:**

- **by 5 November 2026 (without additional charges);**
- **from 6 November 2026 to 31 December 2026 (with a late payment fee of €50.00)**
- **from 1 January 2027 to 31 January 2027 (with a late payment fee of €100.00).**

The following documents are required for the enrolment application:

- ✓ digital copy (front and back) of a valid identity document in PDF or JPG/JPEG format;
- ✓ digital copy (front and back) of the tax code document or health insurance card in PDF or JPG/JPEG format;
- ✓ passport-size photograph in JPG/JPEG format, with a resolution of at least 200 dpi and a size of 480 × 480 pixels (a passport-style photograph for official documents such as an identity card or passport is required, showing the face against a light background; applicants must ensure that the uploaded image correctly fits the designated portrait area);
- ✓ for non-EU candidates residing in Italy only: digital copy (front and back) of a valid residence permit in PDF or JPG/JPEG format, indicating the purpose of issuance.

## 6.2 – Pre-enrolment procedure

Please note that this pre-enrolment procedure is mandatory for all candidates and differs from the University pre-enrolment procedure, which is required only for non-EU candidates residing abroad.

The pre-enrolment procedure must be completed exclusively online via the *Ud'A Online platform* ► <https://unich.esse3.cineca.it> as indicated below.

**Please note: The following procedure does not apply in case of students' transfers from other programs (see. par. 6.4 for instructions):**

- 1) Go to the *Ud'A Online* website ► <https://unich.esse3.cineca.it/> and select "*Registration*" / "*Registration with SPID*", by entering the requested personal information and your bank account details (select *Rimborso bonifico bancario*: IBAN required for refunds);

If you already have valid username and password for the University, use them (you MUST NOT register again). For lost username and passwords contact the InfoStudenti service ► <https://www.unich.it/infostudenti>

- 2) Log in to your "Personal Area" using the your credentials (username and password);
- 3) Select the menu items: *Registrar'Office* → Enrolment;
- 4) choose the enrolment type (see **par. 6.4 – Special cases** for more details):
  - *Standard enrolment*: students who enrol for the first time or without open career in other university and/or in CHIETI-PESCARA university;
  - *Enrolment by transfer*: for applicants continuing their studies after transferring from another university;
  - *Enrolment following withdrawal or loss of student status*: for students enrolling after having withdrawn from or lost previous academic studies, either at this University or another institution;
  - *Enrolment with a previous academic qualification*: for applicants holding another academic qualification of the same level or a higher level.
- 5) select course type: *Degree Course*;
- 6) select the Bachelor's Degree Programme in Economics and Finance (L-33);
- 7) select the relevant category from the following list:
  - *EU and non-EU candidates legally residing in Italy*: "*Economia, Commercio e Finanza*" curriculum (delivered in Italian);
  - *EU and non-EU candidates legally residing in Italy*: "*Economics, Business and Finance*" curriculum (delivered in English);
  - *Non-EU candidates residing abroad*: "*Economia, Commercio e Finanza*" curriculum (delivered in Italian);

- *Non-EU candidates residing abroad: "Economics, Business and Finance" curriculum (delivered in English);*
- 8) (optional) if simultaneously enrolled in another degree programme pursuant to Ministerial Decree No. 930/2022 and/or participating in the "PA 110 e Lode" initiative, complete the relevant additional declarations;
- 9) Choose fee payment type and authorise the automatic acquisition of the ISEE-U certificate from the INPS database;
- 10) enter ID details;
- 11) upload a copy (front and back) of the ID and tax code/health insurance card;
- 12) (optional) in case of disability or certified disability status, complete the relevant forms (for disability status, please state the percentage) and upload a PDF copy of the certificate issued by the relevant bodies of the National Health Service;
- 13) enter the details of the Italian or foreign admission qualification;
- 14) (optional) upload documents providing right to exemption Art. 30 of Law No. 118/1971);
- 15) confirm the enrolment data in the university system and employment status;
- 16) select the type of study attendance for the programme (full-time/part-time). Part-time enrolment is permitted for specific circumstances that prevent regular attendance of courses and completion, within the prescribed time limits, of the relevant examinations and assessments. Part-time enrolment has to be finalized by sending the available form in Modulistica di Ateneo – Iscrizione in regime di studi a tempo parziale ► <https://www.unich.it/didattica/modulistica-studenti/modulistica-generale-di-ateneo> to [segreteria.economia@unich.it](mailto:segreteria.economia@unich.it)

Once these steps have been completed, applicants will be able to view a summary of the entered data and confirm the pre-enrolment.

### 6.3 – Enrolment finalization

Enrolment must be finalised by paying the enrolment fee (including the regional tax for the right to university study and the stamp duty) by 5 November 2026. After this date, late payment fees will be applied in accordance with the University Fees and Contributions Regulations (see *par. 6.1 – Requirements, steps and deadlines*).

**The final deadline for completing enrolment is 31 January 2027 and is strictly non-extendable.**

**PLEASE NOTE: NON-EU CANDIDATES RESIDING ABROAD MAY NOT PAY THE ENROLMENT FEE OR FINALISE ENROLMENT BEFORE OBTAINING A STUDY/UNIVERSITY ENROLMENT VISA (TYPE "D" VISA).**

Pay the fee by accessing your personal area on the *UdA Online* ► <https://unich.esse3.cineca.it> - go to the "Registrar's Office → Payments" section and select one of the available payment methods:

- a) immediate payment: click on "Paga con PagoPA" and select one of the available options;
- b) deferred payment: print the payment notice, which can be presented at authorised service points (e.g. post offices, tobacco shops and authorised retailers, etc.) or at one of the credit institutions participating in the PagoPA system, available at the following address: <https://www.pagopa.gov.it/it/prestatori-servizi-di-pagamento/elenco-PSP-attivi/>.

**WARNING: applicants are advised to check the conditions and operating hours of the Home Banking service provided by their bank. Many credit institutions do not process payments outside service hours, and transactions may only be taken into charge and recorded on the next working day. Payments made on the deadline date outside the bank's operating hours may therefore not be completed within the required time limits, resulting in the risk of exclusion from the selection procedure.**

Payments made by any other methods are not permitted and will not be accepted under any circumstances (e.g. bank transfer). All information regarding payment methods via PagoPA is available on the payment portal at <https://www.pagopa.gov.it/it/dove-pagare/>.

Rules and procedures governing student contributions, as well as the criteria for exemptions and reductions, are set out in the University Fees and Contributions Regulations for 2026/2027 A.Y., published on the University Portal. ► <https://www.unich.it>.

#### 6.4 – Special cases

By paying the enrolment fee, enrolment in the Degree Programme is considered complete, except for candidates falling within the special cases listed below, who must complete the indicated additional requirements. Please refer to the University Fees and Contributions Regulations for 2026/2027 A.Y. for any further contributions to be paid.

- *Candidates holding an entry qualification obtained abroad:* submit the original documentation (or a certified copy) of your academic qualification, previously uploaded, to the Registrar's Office. Such documentation must be complete and comply with all requirements regarding legalisation, translation, and any additional documentation (CIMEA statements, Declaration of Value, and any further required documents)
- *In the case of simultaneous enrolment in two degree programmes pursuant to Law No. 33/2022,* applicants are advised to refer to the dedicated section of the University website ► <https://www.unich.it/didattica/iscrizioni/iscrizione-contemporanea-due-corsi-di-studio>.
- *In the case of participation in the "PA 110 e Lode" program,* applicants are advised to refer to the dedicated section of the University website. ► <https://www.unich.it/didattica/iscrizioni/pa-110-e-lode>.
- *Enrolment following transfer from another university:* at the time of enrolment, send to the following email address [segreteria.economia@unich.it](mailto:segreteria.economia@unich.it) a copy of the receipt of the transfer application, stamped by the Student Administration Office of the home university, or, alternatively, a [self-declaration](#) certifying that the transfer application has been submitted.
- *Program change to the Bachelor's Degree Programme in Economics and Finance:* access your personal area *Ud'A Online* ► <https://unich.esse3.cineca.it> and proceed with the following steps
  - 1) renew enrolment for A.Y. 2026/2027 in the current degree programme by selecting "Renewal/Change of enrolment" (under the Control Panel section) and paying the enrolment fee;
  - 2) Complete the online programme transfer procedure by selecting "Career" → "Programme Transfer", pay the required fee, and send the signed transfer application generated at the end of the procedure to the Student Administration Office of the originally enrolled degree programme and to the following email address [segreteria.economia@unich.it](mailto:segreteria.economia@unich.it)

Any recognition of academic activities completed during the previous academic career will be carried out automatically by the University, on the basis of the academic transcript (transfer certificate).

- *Enrolment with a request for credit recognition (following withdrawal from a previous degree programme or termination of student status), or with a request for a shortened degree programme on the basis of a previously awarded academic qualification.* Applicants must complete and send the relevant form, available in the *Modulistica di Ateneo – Riconoscimento Crediti* ► <https://www.unich.it/didattica/modulistica-studenti/modulistica-generale-di-ateneo>, to [segreteria.economia@unich.it](mailto:segreteria.economia@unich.it)

#### ART. 7 – VERIFICATION OF PERSONAL QUALIFICATIONS AND ADDITIONAL EDUCATIONAL REQUIREMENTS (OFA)

The assessment of personal preparation shall be considered fulfilled upon achieving a score of 10 or higher in the TOLC-E or English TOLC-E tests, or, alternatively, upon passing the CEnT-S or SAT with a standardised score equal to or higher than 23 for the CEnT-S and 980 for the SAT.

Possession of appropriate certification attesting to the successful completion of the aforementioned tests shall automatically ensure the fulfilment of any Additional Learning Requirements (Obblighi Formativi Aggiuntivi – OFA).
