HEREBY DECREES

the following

NOTICE OF SELECTION FOR ADMISSION TO THE MASTER'S DEGREE COURSE in HEALTH PROFESSIONS OF REHABILITATION SCIENCES ACADEMIC YEAR 2026/2027

At the "G. d'Annunzio" University, the admission test for enrollment in the first year of the Master's Degree Course in **Health Professions of Rehabilitation Sciences** (class LM/SNT2) for the academic year 2026/2027 is announced as follows in Article 1:

ART. 1. SPOTS AVAILABLE

The official number of spots for the Master's Degree Course in Health Professions of Rehabilitation Sciences will be announced in a subsequent Decree. The table below shows the provisional number of spots:

ART. 2. REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ADMISSION TEST

An essential and mandatory prerequisite for all candidates is the possession of a five-year upper secondary school diploma or another equivalent qualification obtained abroad (as well as a four-year upper secondary school diploma and the related additional year or, if no longer active, the assigned educational debt).

2.1 QUALIFICATIONS FOR CANDIDATES IN THE AVAILABLE SPOTS CATEGORY

To be eligible for the selection test and possible subsequent enrolment, candidates must possess at least one of the following qualifications:

- a) a degree qualifying for the practice of one of the health professions included in the LM/SNT2 class of Master's Degrees in Rehabilitation Sciences of Health Professions;
- b) a university diploma qualifying for the practice of one of the health professions included in the LM/SNT2 class of Master's Degrees in Rehabilitation Sciences of Health Professions;
- c) a qualification for the practice of one of the health professions included in the LM/SNT2 class of Master's Degrees in Rehabilitation Sciences of Health Professions as per Law No. 42 of February 26, 1999;
- d) other qualification obtained abroad, recognized as suitable according to current regulations. Candidates must obtain a positive evaluation of the eligibility of their foreign title by sending their Degree Diploma and Transcript of Records (along with a copy of the passport) to the e-mail address of the President of the Course, Professor Roberta Di Pietro: roberta.dipietro@unich.it

Candidates who, at the time of application, have yet to obtain the required qualification are admitted to the test and possibly to enrol with reservation, provided that the qualification is obtained by the date of enrolment, and in any case, no later than November 30, 2026.

As the Master's Degree Course is taught in English, another required qualification is proficiency in English at CEFR B2 level, which will be assessed through the entrance test.

ART. 3 PROCEDURES FOR REGISTERING FOR THE ADMISSION TEST

EU citizens residing anywhere, non-EU citizens referred to in Article 26 of Law No. 189/2002 are eligible to participate in the selection outlined in this Notice, as well as non-EU citizens residing abroad in compliance with the online pre-enrolment procedures on the <https://www.universitaly.it/it> website — which must be finalized at diplomatic-consular representatives in accordance with the MUR circular regarding regulations for the admission of foreign students to university courses for the 2026/2027 academic year, available at <https://www.universitaly.it/it/studenti-stranieri>.

Participation in the admission test is subject, under penalty of exclusion, to the procedural steps indicated below:

- A. REGISTRATION** for the selection must be done exclusively online at <http://udaonline.unich.it> - **starting from 12:00 on August 18, 2026, until no later than 15:00 on September 28, 2026**, through:
- **Accessing** the dedicated online service at <http://udaonline.unich.it>;
 - **Registration**, in the reserved area, under the heading REGISTRATION or REGISTRATION WITH SPID.

- **authentication** (login) in the RESERVED AREA using the access credentials (username and password) provided by the registration procedure;

- **choosing** the course type: Master's Degree in Health Professions of Rehabilitation Sciences;
- **choice** of course type: Master's Degree in Health Professions of Rehabilitation Sciences;
- **selection** of the Admission Test;
- **selection** of the Administrative Category;
- **entry** of Access Qualification data;
- **entry** of Academic Qualifications;
- **submission** of a digitized copy of Attachment A, duly completed and in PDF or JPG format, of the academic or training qualifications and professional activities assessable as provided in Art. 4 of Ministerial Decree (DM) 1006 of 06/08/2025, which is fully referenced.

N.B.: Attachment A cannot be replaced by a CV.

PLEASE NOTE: During the competition registration summary stage, the candidate will see a pre-enrollment ID number. This number must be kept and noted down, as it will be used instead of the candidate's full name when lists are published and rankings are drawn up.

To retrieve the pre-enrollment ID number, follow the steps below:

- access the online service at <http://udaonline.unich.it> via the University portal's "MYPAGE" section;
- click on the MENU at the top right and log in (LOGIN) using your existing username and password, or by clicking "ENTRA CON SPID" (Log in with SPID) if you have one;

- the pre-enrollment ID number will be displayed on the screen.

B. PAYMENT of the competition fee of €50.00, which must be made exclusively through the methods available on the webpage under the **SECRETARY – PAYMENTS** menu:

- **Pago PA - Public Administration Payment Portal**, selecting between the online payment methods: credit card, debit card, or a specific payment slip to print and pay at post offices, tobacco shops, authorized retailers, and affiliated bank branches.

1. The payment of the competition fee must be made by 28 September 2026.
2. Payments via bank transfer, postal payment slip, or methods other than those specified in this notice are not permitted;
3. Payment of the €50.00 fee alone, even if made within the deadline, does not constitute registration for the selection test if the online application has not been completed;
4. The competition fee will not be refunded under any circumstances;
5. The online application system will be deactivated strictly by 15.00 PM on 28 September 2026.

ART. 4 PRE-ENROLLMENT PROCEDURES FOR NON-EU CANDIDATES RESIDING ABROAD

Non-EU candidates residing abroad must access the UNIVERSITY portal <https://www.universitaly.it> and complete the “pre-enrollment application” online, following the procedure.

Registration to the test is not subject to the procedures of university pre-enrollment at the Diplomatic-Consular representatives. Once the pre-enrollment application has been completed, candidates must apply to the Italian diplomatic-consular representatives in their country of residence for a study/university enrollment visa.

The University will verify the personal details and evaluate the academic qualifications submitted by candidates, informing the Embassies whether the pre-enrollment application is validated, rejected, or requires additional documentation. Furthermore, it will indicate whether the authenticity of the documents has been verified, and whether the issuance of the relevant *Dichiarazione di Valore* (Declaration of Value) by the diplomatic-consular representatives is required. Validation of the pre-enrollment application by the University does not entitle the candidate to a visa.

N.B. Candidates owning a foreign title must submit their Degree Diploma and Transcript of Records (along with a copy of the passport) to the email address of the Course Director, Professor Roberta Di Pietro (roberta.dipietro@unich.it), for the assessment of the eligibility of their foreign qualifications.

ART. 5. DATE OF THE SELECTION EXAM

The admission test for the Master’s Degree in Health Professions of Rehabilitation Sciences will take place at the Didactic Center – Madonna delle Piane Campus – Via dei Vestini, 31 - CHIETI SCALO on **7 October 2026 at 11:00 AM**.

Candidates for the admission test are summoned – without further notice and/or other communication – at 9:30 AM on 7 October 2026.

ART. 6. VERIFICATION OF CANDIDATES' IDENTITY

On the day of the test (**October 7, 2026**):

A) EU candidates and non-EU candidates legally residing in Italy must present a valid form of identification;

B) Non-EU candidates residing abroad must present a passport containing the specific Type D "national" entry visa for study purposes (University enrollment) or, alternatively, a residence permit or a receipt issued by the Post Office confirming that the application for a residence permit has been submitted. In the latter case, the candidate will be admitted to the exam subject to confirmation, pending the issuance of the required residence permit.

ART. 7. ADMISSION TEST AND EVALUATION CRITERIA

The methods and content of the admission tests for the Master’s Degree programs with nationally limited access for the academic year 2026/2027 are as provided by Ministerial Decree No. 1006 of August, 06, 2026

The test begins at 11:00 AM, and 120 (one hundred and twenty) minutes are allocated for its completion.

The admission test consists of solving eighty questions in English, each with five answer options, from which the candidate must select one, discarding the incorrect, arbitrary, or less likely answers.

Pursuant to Art. 3, paragraph 1 of DM no. 1006 of August, 06, 2026, based on the programs in Annex 1 of the aforementioned decree, the following are prepared:

- Thirty-two questions on the topic of theory/practice relevant to the exercise of healthcare professions included in the master's degree class LM/SNT2;
- Eighteen questions on general culture and logical reasoning;
- Ten questions on the regulation of the exercise of healthcare professions included in the master's degree class LM/SNT2 and healthcare legislation;
- Ten questions on scientific-mathematical culture, statistics, IT, and English;
- Ten questions on human and social sciences.

Pursuant to Art. 4 of Ministerial Decree 1006 of August, 06, 2026 the evaluation commission, appointed by a subsequent decree of the Rector, has one hundred points available, of which eighty are reserved for the written test and twenty for the qualifications. The following criteria are used for test evaluation:

- 1 point for each correct answer;
- Minus 0.25 points for each incorrect answer;
- 0 points for each unanswered question.

Additional qualifications are assigned the following scores:

Academic or training qualifications of at least six months duration	up to 1 point for each qualification, up to a maximum of 3 points
Professional activities in the exercise of one of the healthcare professions included in the master's degree class LM/SNT2, in both public healthcare and private practice, properly documented and certified	0.50 points for each year or period longer than six months, up to a maximum of 4 points
Professional activity in coordination or in a formally specialist function in one of the healthcare professions included in the LM/SNT2 class, properly documented and certified	1 point for each year or period longer than six months, up to a maximum of 5 points
Professors and Tutors of professionalizing disciplines ex MED/45-50 formally appointed in Healthcare Profession degree courses	0.5 points per assignment/year, up to a maximum of 5 points
Research activities documented in scientific publications	up to a maximum of 3 points

The above qualifications are verified by the candidate through self-certification under DPR 445/2000, except as otherwise provided by DM 1006 of 06/08/2026.

In the event of a tie in the final ranking, which adds the score obtained in the written test to the score for qualifications, preference will be given in descending order to the score obtained by the candidate in solving the following questions:

- Theory/practice relevant to the exercise of healthcare professions included in the master's degree class LM/SNT2; general culture and logical reasoning;
- Regulation of the specific professional practice and healthcare legislation;
- Scientific-mathematical culture, statistics, IT, and English; human and social sciences.

ART. 8. CONDUCT OF THE ADMISSION TEST

On the day of the test (**07 October 2026**) candidates will receive:

- a) An identification form;
- b) A packet containing:

- The admission test questions, with the identification code of the packet;
- Two sheets for rough work;
- A response form bearing the same identification code as the packet;

OPERATIONAL MODALITIES OF THE TEST

- a) If multiple rooms are used, candidates will be distributed by age, except for twins. b) For completing the response form, only the black pen provided by the examination commission may be used.
- b) The answer sheet must be filled in exclusively using the black pen provided by the Classroom Commission.
- c) Candidates are prohibited from interacting with each other during the test, and from bringing or using cell phones, handheld devices, smartphones, smartwatches, tablets, earphones, webcams, or similar equipment in the examination rooms. Additionally, they are prohibited from bringing or using pens, pencils, stationery (or any other writing tool) personally, or introducing and/or using manuals, textbooks, including partial reproductions, handwritten notes, blank sheets, and reference materials.
- d) Candidates must sign the identification form, which also serves to verify the correspondence of data under letter h) at the time of submission of the test.
- e) Candidates must mark the chosen answer by placing an X in the corresponding box (drawing diagonals in the square of the answer). It is possible to correct an answer only once, ensuring that the previously marked box is completely filled in before selecting another. Only one X mark must appear in one of the five boxes for the corresponding score to be attributed.
- f) The response form includes a small circular figure next to each question number, which the candidate must cross out to indicate the intention not to answer. This indication, once made, cannot be changed. If the candidate does not mark any of the response boxes, even if they do not cross out the circular figure, the response will still be considered unanswered.
- g) At the end of the test, each candidate will be invited to go to a dedicated station equipped with a pen, located at an appropriate distance from the Commission, where they will find:
 - A box for the submission of the identification form, on whose side the corresponding facsimile of the identification form appears;
 - Pairs of adhesive labels bearing barcodes.
- h) Each candidate must choose a pair of identical adhesive labels and affix one on the identification form and the other on the response form at their own responsibility.

It is the candidate's obligation to ensure that the alphanumeric codes on the selected pair of labels match. he must then sign the declaration of the truthfulness of the personal data and the correspondence of the codes on the labels affixed to the identification form and the response form at the bottom of the identification form. After these operations, the candidate must insert the identification form into the closed container at the dedicated station and move to another dedicated station to insert the form containing their answers, ensuring that the form's front side is facing down so that nothing can be seen.

CAUSES FOR TEST INVALIDATION

1. Completing the test in a room other than the one to which the candidate is assigned, unless the change has been authorized by the examination commission and is recorded in the minutes;
2. Bringing and/or using cell phones, handheld devices, smartphones, smartwatches, tablets, earphones, webcams, or similar equipment, manuals, textbooks, and/or partial reproductions, handwritten notes, and reference materials into the room;
3. Signing the response form (on the front or back) or marking it with any identifying marks by the candidate or a member of the Commission;
4. Interaction between candidates, attempts to copy, or attempts to exchange any material, including the exchange of identification forms and/or response forms in the candidates' possession.

5. Using pens, pencils, or any other writing tools during the operations of inserting the identification form and response form into the designated containers to make changes, additions, and/or corrections to the response form.

The cancellation of the exam is ordered by the Commission. In cases referred to in numbers 1), 2), 3), 4), and 5), CINECA will not determine the score for the cancelled test.

ART. 9. TRANSPARENCY OF PROCEDURAL STAGES

Pursuant to Law 241 of August 7, 1990, and subsequent amendments, Dr. Giulia Zona, Head of the Student Secretariat for the Medicine, Dentistry, Health Professions, Pharmacy, Chemistry and Pharmaceutical Technology (C.T.F.), Geological Sciences, and Motor Sciences programs, has been appointed as the Procedure Officer. Prof. Roberta Di Pietro, President of the Health Professions of Rehabilitation Sciences Degree Program, has been appointed as the Officer responsible for the competition procedure.

A subsequent Rectoral Decree will appoint the Commission in charge of conducting the admission test and the classroom supervisors, along with any additional staff.

The Commission responsible for conducting the test is designated by the School of Medicine and Health Sciences and is composed of a classroom supervisor assisted by another commissioner and alternate members to ensure proper conduct.

The staff responsible for identifying and monitoring the candidates will be appointed by a specific decree of the General Director.

The University "G. d'Annunzio" of Chieti-Pescara makes use of the Student Services Applications Department for online registration procedures for the tests and CINECA for the preparation of the test packages intended for each candidate, in a number corresponding to the estimate of participants based on registrations, increased by five percent, containing the material related to the admission test.

CINECA is also responsible for printing the "instruction sheets for completing the answer form" in a number equal to the test packages prepared for each University.

CINECA is tasked with determining the score for each response form provided by the candidates during the admission tests.

On October 7, 2026, before the test begins, the **classroom Commissioner** will draw four students from the candidates present in the classroom and verify the integrity of the boxes with them; they will then proceed to open the boxes and distribute the test packages according to the number of participants; the Commissioner will also deliver the "instruction sheet for completing the answer form," which will be made available to the candidates before the test begins. The classroom Commissioner will carefully prepare a statement confirming the integrity of the boxes, the number of test packages distributed, and any unused ones. This statement will also be signed by the four selected students. **The classroom supervisor will also prepare the classroom report.**

Each box contains:

- a) 50 test packages containing the materials for the test;
- b) an envelope containing 55 pairs of pre-cut adhesive labels with a barcode and corresponding alphanumeric code, intended for matching the test with the candidate's personal information form.

Each test package contains:

1. The English-language questions related to the admission test, bearing the identification code of the package, as well as two sheets for rough drafts;
2. An answer form with the same identification code as the package.

If one or more candidates report any irregularities regarding the package received, the classroom supervisor will verify the validity of the report and, if necessary, replace the package. This operation will be recorded in the classroom report along with the reasons. The replacement of even one of the documents mentioned in points 1) and 2) during the test requires the replacement of the entire package, as these documents are marked with the same package identification code.

The classroom supervisor, at the time of delivering the answer forms and in the presence of each candidate, must retain the following materials for preservation by the University, both for the purpose of formulating the final merit ranking and for any future requests for access to documents:

1. The sheets with the printed questions related to the test;
2. The personal information form;
3. The sheets for rough drafts.

At the end of the test, the classroom supervisor must also:

- a) Insert all the answer forms into the appropriate containers, which must be sealed in the presence of the same candidates who were called to verify the integrity of the boxes or, in any case, of four other randomly selected candidates;
- b) Insert all the personal information forms into the appropriate containers provided by CINECA (where a facsimile of the personal information form appears on one side), which must be sealed in the presence of the same candidates who were called to verify the integrity of the boxes or, in any case, of four other randomly selected candidates;
- c) Affix a signature on the labels used to seal the containers;
- d) Invite the four students to sign on the same label already signed by the classroom supervisor;
- e) Package other containers in which the returned test packages, those that were replaced, and any unused ones, along with the statement confirming the integrity of the boxes, the number of packages distributed, and the number of unused packages, will be enclosed. This statement will also be signed by the four selected students.

The correction of the tests is carried out by CINECA, which is responsible for determining the score for each answer form provided by the candidates through optical reading. CINECA will prepare an anonymous ranking of the scores according to the criteria outlined in Art. 7 of this Notice.

The University will draft the ranking for EU and non-EU candidates, as per Art. 26 L. n. 189/2002, based on the scores obtained in the test and the evaluation of qualifications.

ART. 10. DATE OF PUBLICATION OF THE MERIT RANKING

The results of the competition will be announced by **October 21, 2026**, through publication on the **"Online Official Notice Board" page and in the dedicated section "Admission Competitions to Degree Courses with Limited Access – A.Y. 2026/2027" on the University website www.unich.it (path: Didactics > Courses with Limited Access)**. This publication of the merit ranking will serve as the only official means of communication, replacing all personal notifications to the domicile or residence of the concerned individuals. Any subsequent updates will be made every three working days, excluding Saturdays and holidays, through a notice published on the "Online Official Notice Board" page in the dedicated section "Admission Competitions to Degree Courses with Limited Access – A.Y. 2026/2027" on the University website (<http://www.unich.it> – menu: DIDACTICS > COURSES WITH LIMITED ACCESS). Candidates on the waiting list who do not complete their enrolment by the specified deadlines will lose their right to enrol, regardless of the reason for the delay.

ART. 11. ENROLMENTS

At the start of the online enrolment procedure, students must have the following documents available:

- a) A digital copy in PDF or JPG format of a complete identity document;
- b) A digital copy in PDF or JPG format of the tax code;
- c) A passport-size photo in JPG or JPEG format according to the specifications of the 2026-2027 Academic Manifest of this University.

Successful candidates from the admission test must enrol by 1:00 PM on October 30, 2026, under penalty of disqualification.

Any updates to the ranking will be published every three (3) working days, excluding Saturdays and holidays.

Successful candidates – both EU and non-EU – must enrol exclusively online at <http://udaonline.unich.it> according to the following procedure:

1. Connect to the dedicated online service at <http://udaonline.unich.it>
2. Log in to the "Reserved Area" section using the login credentials (username and password) provided during the admission test registration process;
3. Select the SECRETARY option \ENROLLMENT;
4. Choose the type of enrolment:
 - o **Standard enrolment:** students enrolling for the first time or students with no open careers at this or other universities;
 - o **Enrolment by transfer:** students requesting the continuation of their career by transferring from another university;
 - o **Enrolment due to withdrawal/termination:** students enrolling following withdrawal and/or termination from previous careers (**both internal and external to the University**);
 - o **Enrolment with another academic degree.**
5. Select the Master's Degree in Health Professions of Rehabilitation Sciences;
6. Enter the requested information regarding employment status and authorizations for ISEEU data extraction from the INPS portal;
7. Enter identity document details;
8. Upload a copy of the identity document and tax code;
9. Complete, if applicable, the sections related to disability or invalidity, ensuring to indicate the percentage of invalidity, if requested, and upload a digital copy in PDF or JPG format of the certification issued by the competent structures of the National Health Service;
10. Attach a passport-size photo in JPG or JPEG format with a resolution of at least 200 dpi and dimensions of 480x480 pixels – max 2MB – (use a document photo like an ID card or passport that shows the face on a light background);
11. Upload the required qualification.

If the conditions of Art. 30 of Law n. 118 of March 30, 1971, apply, upload a digital copy in PDF or JPG format of the documentation related to the parent's disability pension and the substitute family status declaration.

Upon enrolment, winners of the competition who are enrolled at other universities or in other degree programs at this University are required to send a copy of the transfer/change/withdrawal request issued by the Registrar's Office of the originating degree program, or a substitute declaration certifying the submission of the request, in accordance with the provisions of D.P.R. 445/2000 and subsequent amendments, to the email address segreteria.fisioterapiamagistrale@unich.it. Failure to do so will result in the enrolment process not proceeding.

Candidates holding a degree obtained abroad will be enrolled on the condition that they present the original degree (accompanied by an official Italian translation, legalization, and a declaration of value issued by the competent Italian diplomatic-consular representation) and that all access requirements set by current regulations for university admission are met. The degree obtained abroad and the residence permit must be submitted as soon as the student obtains them in order to regularize their status as soon as possible and ensure full functionality of online services.

ART. 12. CANDIDATES WITH DISABILITIES, SPECIAL NEEDS, AND SPECIFIC LEARNING DISORDERS (DSA)

The tests are organized by the University, taking into account the individual needs of candidates with a civil disability equal to or greater than 66%, those with disabilities pursuant to art. 16 of Law no. 104/1992, as well as candidates with a diagnosis of specific learning disorders (DSA) as per Law no. 170/2010.

In relation to their respective personal needs, candidates must promptly submit a specific request to the University for the organization of the test, indicating any necessary aids, additional time compared to the general candidates, and other measures to ensure equal opportunities during the test.

These conditions must be documented by appropriate medical certification issued by the competent Medical Commission, proving the type of disability and/or degree of handicap, with the University reserving the right to request further documentation.

Candidates with a civil disability of 66% or higher or a disability pursuant to art. 16 of Law no. 104/1992 are granted additional time equal to up to 50% more than the time defined for the admission tests.

Candidates with a diagnosis of specific learning disorders (DSA) under Law no. 170/2010, issued no more than three years ago or after the age of eighteen by local health authorities or accredited entities, may submit a request indicating the necessary aids, additional time, and other measures to ensure equal opportunities.

The additional time granted is 30% more than the time defined for admission tests. In cases of severe DSA, certified to ensure equal opportunities, the following compensatory tools may be allowed: non-scientific calculator, video magnifier, or the assistance of a reader chosen by the University with the support of experts or the University's disabilities and DSA service.

The following tools are not allowed: dictionary, formula book, periodic table of elements, concept maps, personal computer, tablet, smartphone, and similar devices. Candidates with disabilities or DSA residing abroad who wish to use these measures must submit legalized certification attesting to their condition, issued in their country of residence, accompanied by a sworn translation in Italian or English.

The University's Disability Service will review the certification to verify that the foreign documentation demonstrates a condition of disability or learning disorder recognized by Italian law. The request for necessary aids must be completed using the form attached to this notice under letter B) and sent by email to: misure.compensative@unich.it by September 30, 2026.

ART. 13. PRIVACY POLICY

This University processes the personal data provided by candidates in compliance with the provisions of the EU Regulation – GDPR – 679/2016 and the CODAU Guidelines on privacy and data protection in universities, adopted by the University with resolution no. 119/2018 of April 24, 2018. As the Data Controller, the personal data provided will be used exclusively for managing the admission test and, if applicable, for the subsequent enrolment in the degree course outlined in this notice. Failure to provide or refusal to provide data will prevent the Data Controller and the subsequent personnel from performing the necessary processing operations to establish any relationship with this University. The personal data provided by candidates for the admission tests will be kept indefinitely if they are successful in the selection process and proceed to actual enrolment in the course of interest at this University, which will assume responsibility as the Data Controller from that moment. The personal data provided by candidates who do not establish a subsequent relationship with the University will be kept, in compliance with Art. 5 of GDPR 679/2016, until the conclusion of the competition procedure.
